(i.e. NO REGULATORY OR INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY CONCERNS)

- YOU WORK IN **MULTIPLE** LOCATIONS & USE **MULTIPLE** DEVICES
- YOU HAVE **NO** ON-STAFF EXPERTISE (INTERNAL IT SUPPORT)
- YOU OWN **OLDER** HARDWARE
- YOU OWN **OLDER** SOFTWARE OR **WANT** TO MIGRATE TO NEWER
- YOUR EMPLOYEES **REQUIRE** SECURE **REMOTE** ACCESS
- YOU HAVE **CONSISTENT** AVAILABILITY (CONNECTIVITY)
- YOU HAVE **PHYSICAL** SECURITY ISSUES

(i.e. REGULATORY OR INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY CONCERNS)
